

### Activity Orders Redesign Providence Instance of Epic October 16, 2018

#### Who is affected by this change?

All nurses, licensed independent practitioners (LIPs), nursing assistants, therapists, and transporters who place or review activity orders. *This is a high-impact change for ordering providers.*

#### What is the change?

There will now be **1 primary activity order (ACT20)** and **1 new temporary activity order (ACT21)**. Specific activity order details, including bracing, positioning, activity levels, and restrictions, will be inside a single order.


#### Why is this change being made?

Previously, activity orders were found in many different locations in the EHR: activity orders, nursing orders, temporary orders, consult orders, and management orders. Frequently, these orders were in conflict with each other, causing concern for patient safety. To add to this confusion, activity orders lacked common terminology with agreed upon definitions.

#### What do we need from you?

Awareness that current activity order data will now be collected within a single order and displayed in reports and widgets.

Clicking “Show Details” displays additional information. A red banner alerts clinicians of temporary orders.

- **Reports**

The **Activity Summary Report** displays all current activity orders, restrictions & temporary activity orders. The accordion report shows the history of all activity orders placed on a patient. Information from the current activity order will populate the Activity Orders report, Overview reports, Ticket to Ride report, & PT/OT orders.

- **Temporary Activity Orders**- requires an indication and duration for activity restriction. Current temporary activity orders will display as a red banner within the reports and widgets. **Once the temporary order condition(s) have been met nurses must complete the order** and the patient will return to their prior activity order. The temporary order will not expire without nursing action.
